In positions with Senior Services and Council on Aging, Mrs. Thompson helped develop innovative programs for the elderly such as the Friendly Visitor Program for the homebound and shut-in and the Senior Passport program. She

recruited private employers to retool the over "55" age group through the Senior Job Registry, with computer classes and new-on-the-job training skills.

She "retired" in 1991, but has continued working with the elderly. She now counsels



older adults in the areas of depression, guilt, and related issues.

Mrs. Thompson also has been an active volunteer with many civic organizations.

She was married to the late William Thompson. Her son is an educational administrator in Florida and her daughter, Mrs. Sherry T. Scott, is a marketing and communications professional in Cincinnati.

ennedy Heights Citizens On Patrol (K.H.C.O.P.) team is trained to be extra eyes and ears for Cincinnati Police. We walk, watch, listen, and report. We have a new goal for 2003:

To encourage *every* law-abiding resident of Kennedy Heights to qualify as a member of K.H.C.O.P., so you can walk with us once a month.

What It Takes

One planning meeting, and a twohour stroll with neighbors once a month, that's all it takes! Brain engaged, eyes and ears open, watching our neighborhood blossom and communicate. A commitment we gladly make, for ourselves and for all of you.

Our mission, as given by City of Cincinnati Police, is simple - To be the eyes and ears for District Two. We need to be awake and aware (that's why we take the training), but we're still only walking, watching, listening, and reporting.

Four Steps

In four steps, you can help us reach our goal for 2003:

- 1. Take the Citizens On Patrol training
- 2. Get the gear (cap, shirt, jacket, ID badge)
- Show up for our one-hour meeting each month
- 4. Walk with us once a month (or more often, if you want)

Can't Walk? Join the Stationary Patrol

or several years there has been no "neighborhood school" in Kennedy Heights.

Unless you apply for and are accepted into one of the City's "magnet" schools (including Woodford), your elementary children are assigned to one of three "neighborhood schools" outside of Kennedy Heights. Which school depends on where you live. According to the School Board, we now have 650 kids in grades K-8. Here's where they attend school:

Assigned Neighborhood

■ Pleasant Ridge: 63

Silverton: 63

■ Parker (Madisonville): 94

Magnet (by application)

■ Woodford: 108


■ Eastwood: 16

Other Public: 154

Private/Parochial: 152

The School Board's new "Facilities Master Plan, would move the Pleasant Ridge school to the corner of Kennedy & Montgomery. The new building would continue to be the neighborhood school for the same attendance area that is now assigned to Pleasant Ridge.

The Board has been urged to--and could--reject the Administration's recommendations and build the new school in Pleasant Ridge. The State (which is paying part of the construction cost) would still have to approve the change. The Board may make its decision in March.


- Teen Center's Hair Show raised \$114 to donate to the Ronald McDonald House.
