### KH Crime Blotter


t the June 17 KHCC meeting, Police Captain Curetan got an earful from residents concerned about criminal activity in KH. At the June meeting the hot topics were drug dealers and prostitutes. At the end of the evening, Hilda Coaston (Hedge Ave.) suggested that we dedicate an entire Council meeting solely to discussions of crime problems.

Capt. Curetan began by reporting that police have been using "decoy cars"; these are patrol cars that are parked in a conspicuous location, often unoccupied. Just as an empty patrol car on the freeway can make you slow down, the decoy cars are supposed to deter criminal activity.

Recent focus of police has been on Northdale, Kennedy/Montgomery, and Solar Vista.

- Guys loitering near home on Kennedy have become so bold that they use the driveway and even the water tap as if they owned them. "They're so comfortable that they make you feel like you're invading their space!"
- Prostitute has been openly soliciting on Rogers Park and Montgomery down to the corner of Orchard.
- Capt. Curetan said prostitution has been particularly bad in KH. The prostitutes tend to be young teens (some "very young") tied to drug dependence and drug dealers. Vice arrests are very hard to make, and he urged anyone solicited to call and support an arrest.
- "Drug boys" on both sides of Kennedy have been seen actually stopping the traffic. Shoes have reappeared on power wires. [Instead of billboards, drug dealers hang sneakers over phone lines to say "buy drugs here!"] Fire Capt. Long will see that they are removed.

• Major grant: acquisition and demolition of the space from the former Mr. Kelley's to the corner of Kennedy, for development of mixeduse neighborhood businesses.

• Minor grant: Market study for the Montgomery Road corridor.

Grants are targeted for

neighborhoods with lower income than Kennedy Heights. But this will assure City Hall of our interest and increase chances with future requests consistent with the Community Plan.

• Council endorsed applying for the grants by a voice vote, with no dissent. A more complete proposal will be before Council on 7/15.

## Pit Bulls & Other Vicious Dogs

Pit bulls have been legal in Cincinnati since 1999. But if you see one on the street or in your neighbor's yard, it's probably illegal.

Pit bulls (& other vicious dogs) must be tattooed & registered with the police. Owners must have \$50,000 in liability insurance.

Only 5 pit bulls have been registered since 1999.

Call the police and report any suspicious, vicious dogs. City Council is now considering a new pit bull ban.
