
# KHCC Meeting Highlights: 9/16/03

# Announcements and Comments

- The **Progressive Dinner** was a great success with at least 50% more profit than the previous year.
- Carol Chamberlain, director of The Caring Place announced several activities planned for the community youth, including a job fair in May 2004.
- Ernie Barbeau was elected Citizen of the Year. Congratulations were expressed and various residents made testimonies.
- GED class is being offered at the Recreation Center. Narcotics Anonymous at the Rec Center has attendance of 50 people!
- To participate in the planning for community schools i.e. Schroder School, show up at the next planning meeting.
- The purchase of the KH Art Center is still in progress.
- Ernie Barbeau distributed a handout for The Overture Awards for High School arts students in Cincinnati.
- Kay Briggs has resigned her contract position as community coordinator. The executive committee is considering individual contracts for activities and needs.

# PWC + KHCC = Prepare Affair


Volunteers are needed work with People Working Cooperatively (PWC) to help elderly or disabled KH homeowners prepare their yards and homes for the winter.

# Stop The Cave Update

A Madeira dentist and his Bellevue son intend to build a drive-thru pony keg on the corner of Kennedy & Montgomery, where Richie's once stood. This does not fit the KHCC community plan, and KHCC has actively opposed the "Beverage Cave" since it was first announced in May.

Richard Cooke (Rogers Park) heads up the Stop The Cave subcommittee. His committee worked at a whirlwind pace throughout September.

- Over 1,000 letters from KH residents & businesses to City officials opposing a liquor permit for the Cave.
- Close contact with key officials at City Hall.
- Meeting with police, Geier Apts., Cornerstone Church, and the businessmen who want to build the Cave.

### First Results: 9/24

City Council passed two key measures on 9/24:

- ♦ Official opposition to the Cave's liquor permit application. This assures we will have a chance to oppose the permit at a public hearing by the state Liquor Board (no date for that yet).
- ♦ "IDC" designation for the
  Montgomery Road corridor (north &
  south of Kennedy Ave.). Councilman
  Tarbell's Motion was supported by all
  9 Council members. This effectively
  puts all development in that area "on
  hold" while the City reviews zoning.
  KHCC hopes to get the same zone
  designation as applies along
  Montgomery in Pleasant Ridge. That
  does not permit drive-thru businesses.

This was the first skirmish in what could be a long battle. There's much more to come.

Kudos & praises to the hardy and tenacious souls whose imagination, determination, hard work, and long hours have got us to this point....and the same to the residents who signed the letters & petitions.
