ccording to the Board of Education, there are over 600 elementary school students in Kennedy Heights. They attend many different schools, including 3 "neighborhood" schools--none of which is in our neighborhood.

At recent Council meetings members have voted to support merging our students into a single attendance area and to push the School Board to build a new school at the corner of Kennedy & Montgomery.

KHCC wants to make sure it is accurately representing the interests and concerns of KH students & parents. Because our students are split among so many schools, it's hard to communicate directly with parents.

SKYY claims it has met all requirements and the City violated its constitutional rights by using the "Interim Development Corridor" to block its permit application.

The City's answer to the lawsuit is due in late April.

Constitutional Amendments On 4/20 Agenda

he constitutional review committee has recommended significant changes in the way KHCC is governed. The proposed amendments had their first reading at the March meeting and will be before Council for approval at the April meeting.

Summary of Proposed Changes

- Restructure the present "Executive Committee" as a "Board of Trustees"
- The Board of Trustees will have 9 elected members: The five present offices plus four new members-at-large.
- Rename the current position of "Vice-President" to be "Vice-President for Administration"
- Remove confusing reference to the "president elect"
- Remove the requirement that nominees for president have served at least one year as an officer.

Two-Thirds Vote Required

To pass, the amendments must be approved by two-thirds of the members present at the April meeting. Review full text at www.kennedyheights.org

Minutes of KHCC General Meeting March 17

Actions Taken/Motions Passed

changes to the constitution. He stated that there will be a second reading in April and the intent is to request a vote at that time. In addition to the distributed changes, a motion was carried and unanimously approved to remove the constitutional requirement that nominees for president must have served at least the previous year on the executive committee. (changes are summarized on p. 1).

Grant Proposal: Application for additional \$2,000 from Invest in Neighborhoods for a "house to house" community survey to determine the community interests for education and business.

Consolidating School Attendance Areas: Ce Holm presented a proposal for presentation to the School Board to address concerns about fragmented attendance areas. The proposal was approved.

- Combine all students living in the city of Silverton and the Kennedy Heights neighborhood into one Attendance Area.
- Build a combined neighborhood school for this combined attendance area at Montgomery and Kennedy.
- Renovate Woodford Magnet School and keep it as a Magnet School which will be racially balanced and open to students throughout Quadrant 3.

- → Arts Center: There are lots of activities in progress and the center has been awarded various grants. Continued support will be appreciated.
- → Litter Magic: Jeffrey Weidner asked residents to review the newsletter article on Litter Magic and to sign up for COPS.
- → Block Watch: Donna Faulk announced the Block Watch meeting at KHPC on Saturday (3/20) at 11 AM.
- → Sap Run: Sap Run (May 4) will include aerobics in the Woodford gym
- → Bike Patrols Return: Cincinnati Police will again be patrolling KH on two wheelers this spring and summer.
- → Safety Fair: Children's Safety Fair at Sawyer Point on May 5.
- → Beautification Chair: Diana Santos, a 20-year KH resident is the new committee chair.
- → CODC: Development committee is interviewing firms that submitted market study proposals on March 18 for the KM corridor and surrounding area.
- → Baseball Coaches needed: Karen Thomas is still in need of a coach for the 6-7 year olds. She has organized 4 teams so far and was commended by Mimi Gingold for her efforts.
- → Day Camp Registration: Summer Day Camp registration has begun at the PR Recreation Center.

Art Works: A representative from Art Works gave an overview of a summer program with job opportunities for high school students ages 14 to 21. Flyers were available at the meeting and more information and applications can be obtained at **www.artworkscincinnati.com.** *Interview sessions start April 17.*

Rebuilding Shroder: Architects for the School Board presented an overview of the plans for a new high school at Duck Creek and Eastwood. The Shroder Paideia Academy will be re-built on the site while classes continues at the old school. The School Board representative said that they could be forced to build on another site if the Eastwood site fails a second seismic inspection.

Litter Patrol Zones Keeping up appearances

Litter Magic hat happens when the three Litter Magic clean-up events are over? Does all the hard work of your neighbors just disappear, or reappear as litter? It's doesn't need to, and here's how you can help make sure it doesn't. Become a Litter Patrol Zone Volunteer!

What is this program?

A person, couple, family, or group of neighbors adopt a "Litter Patrol Zone" in Kennedy Heights to clean on a regular basis for one year.

There are 12 zones, each about 1 mile long. It is not necessary to sign-up for the zone where you live. The more we spread out the cleaner the neighborhood!

How does it work?

You patrol your zone at least once a month, but more is better! Trash bags and plastic gloves are available. You are free to call me for supplies when necessary. The trash you collect would be added to your regular weekly pickup by the Sanitation Department.

How do I join?

You can sign-up at the Great American Clean-up. A list of all volunteers in your zone will be mailed to you. You are free to meet and arrange a regular schedule with your fellow patrol zone volunteers. If you can't make the signup but are interested just give me a call.
