CPOP Targets Drugs on Kennedy

Over the summer a dozen or so concerned KH residents have been meeting with police and the CPOP staff to devise a plan for making KH a safer and better place to live. CPOP (Community Problem Oriented Policing) provides a process for identifying, targeting, and solving problems.

The CPOP team had no problem identifying the heart of the problem: drugs and thugs on Kennedy Avenue. They've narrowed their focus to Kennedy between Northdale and Woodford and are now working on creative responses. These include contacting and working closely with landlords to alert them to suspicious behaviors, encourage better tenant screening, and reduce the likelihood that their apartments will be used as safe houses for drug dealers and prostitutes.

CPOP meetings are now monthly on the 4th Tuesday at 8:00 p.m. in the office building at the corner of Kennedy & Montgomery. Join 'em!

Beverage Cave Status

Since June, 2003, KHCC and residents have been opposing plans by a Madeira dentist to build a drive thru beer/wine store at the corner of Kennedy & Montgomery.

Liquor Permit Denial Appealed

SKYY Properties appealed the Liquor Board's decision denying a permit for the Beverage Cave. The state has not yet scheduled a hearing on the appeal, which will be held in Columbus

City Sued

SKYY Properties also sued the City of Cincinnati for refusing to issue a permit to build the Beverage Cave after imposing an "Interim Development Control" (IDC) on the Montgomery Road corridor.

Common Pleas Judge Russell heard oral arguments on part of the suit on 8/26. If the judge decides in SKYY's favor, the IDC could be ruled illegal. If the City wins, the City may be free to adopt new zoning restrictions as proposed by KHCC's Comprehensive Plan and Urban Design Overlay Guideline

Announcements

- CPOP/SARA 12 residents attended SARA training. CPOP representative Anika Simpson announced the first KH CPOP meeting for 6/22/04.
- KH Arts Center Grand Opening on 6/19; volunteers needed to help with greeting, registration etc. Call 631 4ART to register for children's classes.
- Councilman Pepper spoke briefly of the Safe/Clean Streets Grant and the City's efforts to fight crime. The councilman was asked to investigate and report on the boundary lines between KH & Pleasant Ridge.
- KHCC president Noel Morgan & Van Foster met with representatives from City Hall to discuss the \$29,000 feasibility study which KH is scheduled to receive soon. The status of the \$1.8 million is not known at this time.
- KHCC needs a liaison for with management of Hill Top apartments. This will be discussed at the next meeting.
- Bruce Long, Housing chair, asked once again for volunteers to assist with painting, etc, to help residents in the neighborhood. Sign up sheets were available at the meeting.

Police Report

- 797 calls for service between January & April time period.
- Officer Miller encouraged residents to attend the CPOP meetings and advised that we look for ways other than arrest to curtail the drug problem in the community. Discussions with the residents included topics about 3-4 am as prime time for drug activity and prostitution.
- 6/29 sentencing for KH drug dealer Gary Hedges. A six-year State sentence is proposed. [Note: He was, in fact, sentenced to 6 years in prison for possession of drugs and firearms]

Planning for Montgomery Road Corridor

KHCC Business & Office Development Committee

Feasibility Study Underway

In August KHCC finally received a promised City grant of \$30,000 to study the feasibility of commercial development along Montgomery Road.

KHCC has contracted with city planning consultants *Kinzelman Kline Gossman* to conduct the study. The final product should be complete by October, and preliminary design proposals have been ambitious and impressive.

Some of their work will be displayed during the Desserts & Auction at the Arts Center on 9/18.

UDOG

Valerie Butler has produced an impressive **U**rban **D**esign **O**verlay **G**uideline, recommending pedestrianfriendly zoning for the Montgomery Rd. corridor.

The KHCC Board approved the UDOG in a special session on 8/31 and forwarded it to the City Planning Commission.

City Council put development between Tyne & Coleridge "on hold" last September. That order is set to expire on 9/24/04 unless new zoning is approved.
