Motions Adopted

- ✓ Beautification contract (\$750) to maintain community gardens
- ✓ Extensive revisions to the KHCC ByLaws
- Reaffirm to the School Board KHCC's support for combining all KH elementary students into a single attendance area, with new school and that the school should be built at Kennedy & Montgomery
- ✓ Ask the School Board to convene a joint meeting with KH & Silverton
- ✓ Actively seek a slot for KHCC on the Woodford LSDMC

Announcements

- Mr. Kelly's property has been purchased by Deer Park Auto; Building Department is citing for zoning code violations for storing autos.
- Liquor Board appeal hearing for the *Beverage Cave* has yet to be scheduled.
- Caring Place is having a fundraising campaign, whose purpose is to replace some of the moneys they loss from cutback in City of Cincinnati funding.

Recreation

Karen Williams, *Pleasant Ridge/ Kennedy Heights Community Center*, reported on the following

- enrollment for summer camp
- availability of a Tai Chi (Yang style) program, which began April 9, 9:00a.m.-11:00a.m.; the program is free with membership card and all ages are welcome
- Games Day continues thru June 4, 2nd & 4th Saturdays, 10-Noon, featuring tabletop, strategy games, collectable card games, and miniatures battle games; open for kids between 6 & 14.

Police Report

Neighborhood Police Officer George Engleman

- Two adolescent boys have been identified in connection with rash of car break-ins.
- The Police Department will assign a Speedwagon to KH (a mobile unit that displays speed of oncoming cars).

- The crime rate in KHCC remains one of the lowest in all of the City's 52 neighborhoods.
- Some residents are concerned about aggressive dogs and needed information about what policies and procedures govern assistance from the police and the SPCA.
- A Ravenal Court expressed frustration with police response to her complaints about parked cars on Ravenal Court.

Liquor Permit Renewal

- Officer Engleman reported on City Council hearing on renewal of liquor permits, including Wilson's Grocery (at Zinsle & Red Bank). KHCC has formally asked City Council to object to the permit. However, KHCC was not well represented at the 4/19 hearing. Councilmember Laketa Cole recommended that the parties try reach an agreement. Extended discussion followed.
- Mr. & Mrs. Canty, Beech View residents & present owners of the permit, said that the license has been in the family for nearly 65 years. Although the grocery store has been closed for the past four years it is still being blamed as the cause for police service runs. The Cantys are considering a walkup type of business and said they want the store to be an asset to the community.

Constitutional Revisions

Proposed changes unanimously passed, with amendments to retain current definitions of resident members, assuring inclusion of residents on both sides of border streets.

School Site

- Ce Holm reported on the April 11 School Board meeting. The School Administration has again recommended rebuilding Silverton School in Silverton rather than at Kennedy & Montgomery. Residents of both Silverton and KH spoke at the Board meeting. The Board has not yet decided the issue.
- After extended discussion, four, related resolutions (see above) were adopted.
- Van Foster, Chair of Commercial Development and Office Committee, reported on the process that CPS must use to dispose disposal of real property . Van and KHCC's *Feasibility*consultant have begun meeting with CPS to identify alternative uses for the CPS property that meet the community's needs.

CPOP

- Ben Pipkin, CPOP Team Leader, reported that
- KHCC has been awarded a \$9,000.00 grant from the Cincinnati Neighborhood Business Districts United
- CPOP meets monthly on the last Tuesday at the KHCC office. CPOP's main focus is reducing the sale of drugs, especially from Woodford and Northdale Place.
- Crime stats from Northdale they were surprised high rate of police calls related to domestic violence and family violence. CPOP has asked for help from the YWCA and the Rape Crisis and Abuse Center of Hamilton County.

Juneteenth commemorates the end of American slavery in 1865.

The local Festival began in 1988 in KH's Drake Park, organized by the Juneteenth Committee of KHCC.

The Saturday Festival has since moved to Eden Park, but is still based in KH.

New feature this year: A Sunday (Father's Day) concert in Seasongood Pavilion featuring numerous Cincinnati gospel choir. This revives the "June Festival," Cincinnati's segregated counterpart to the May Festival that performed at Seasongood for two decades into the late 1950's.


