## **CPOP Bumps Bridge**

une 6, KH residents added a new dimension to the concrete bridge walls at Kennedy & Woodford.

The KHCC CPOP team observed that the bridge has long been a focal point for drug dealing and suspicious loitering. And it's not uncommon in good weather to see numerous guys sitting on the bridge walls.

The team wondered whether there was some way to make the bridge a less comfortable place.

Their solution: Bridge bumps. Hundreds of half-egg-shaped concrete bumps. Fabricated in Ben Pipkin's garage and glued down by enthusiastic residents.

The first set have been set into place. It took only a couple of hours for the cement to set. And once the full set has been placed, the bridge should no longer be such a great place to sit.

## Domestic Violence: Debunking the Myths

"CPOP" is short-hand for Community Problem Oriented Policing.

To help identify problems & determine the safety needs of our community, KH CPOP has been analyzing calls for police service.

We were surprised by the number of calls reporting domestic violence. So we invited Sandy Braslow from the Rape and Domestic Violence Center to our April meeting to educate us about domestic violence. She dispelled some of common myths about domestic violence:

#### Myth: Family violence is rare

Although statistics on family violence are not precise, it's clear that millions of children, women and even men are abused mentally and physically by family members.

## Myth: Family violence is confined to low income households.

Reports from police records, victim services, and academic studies show domestic violence exists equally in every socioeconomic group, regardless of race or culture.

## Myth: Alcohol and drug abuse are the real causes of domestic violence.

Domestic violence and substance abuse are two different problems that should be treated separately. Although drugs and alcohol can make the violence more extreme, they do not cause it. Abusers typically control their actions even when drunk or high, by choosing a time and places for the assaults that take place in private and go undetected. Successful completion of a drug treatment program does not guarantee an end to battering.

#### What can we do as Individuals or as a community?

- Call the police if you see or hear evidence of domestic violence.
- Speak out publicly against domestic violence.
- Take action personally against domestic violence when a neighbor, coworker, a friend, or family member is involved or being abused.
- Encourage your neighborhood watch or block association to become as concerned with watching for domestic violence as with burglaries and other crimes.
- Reach out to support someone whom you believe is a victim of domestic violence and/or talk with a person you believe is being abusive.

#### **Learn More About Domestic Violence**

Join us for the June Council meeting (June 21st, 7:30) when a representative from the Rape & Domestic Violence Center will be there to teach more about domestic violence and what we as a community can do to help prevent it.

## Highlights of KHCC General Meeting on 5/17/05

■ Shelley Bromberg (Beechview) asked that Council consider an appropriate memorial for Pace resident Laura Domenik. Mrs. Domenik's car was struck as she was turning onto Montgomery from Orchard. There were several suggestions, and the Board will follow-up.

#### Paint KH?

■ Representatives of Give Back Cincinnati explained their "Paint the Town" project and invited KHCC to apply to be "painted" in 2006. Paint the Town selects one neighbrohood each year and, with the Commnity council's help, identifies as many as 25 homes that need a fresh pain job and help getting it done. With hundreds of volunteers they do all of the houses in a single day. At no cost to the homeowners.

Last year they painted Northside. On June 11 they will paint Madisonville. And next year, if we're selected, they will paint Kennedy Heights.

- Board actions ratified: \$500 donation to the Juneteenth Festival; \$750 toward landscape contract with Charles Young (already budgeted).
- Officer Engleman reported a rash of vehicle break-ins. A couple of arrests have been made, but it is uncertain whether they have all culprits.
