Adopt-A-Spot, a program of Keep Cincinnati Beautiful, called, has a foothold in Kennedy Heights.

This program was mentioned at the April Litter Magic clean-up and five Kennedy Heights neighbors are now involved.

Adopt -A-Spot is a clean-up/ beautification program that encourages residents to work on improving their neighborhoods by adopting litter "hot spots," planting flowers, and removing graffiti.

You are limited only by your imagination. Each Adopt-A-Spot program participant receives public recognition in the form of an attractive sign installed by the City's Public Services Department within the adopted area.

The sign has the individual's name on it. That way, neighbors will know whose hard work went into making the neighborhood more attractive.

Feasibility Study Unveiled

Want a peek at the future of KH...the future that could be?

Make sure you attend the KHCC's general meeting on 8/17.

The consulting firm of Kinzelman Kline Gossman (KKG) has completed its study of the feasibility of a business complex in the area around the corner of Kennedy and Montgomery.

The study was funded by a \$30,000 grant from the City of Cincinnati and is a comprehensive and critical evaluation of the prospects for development in that corridor.

KKG will present its results at the August 15 meeting. The final report will also be published on the KHCC website.

This has been a project of KHCC's Office & Business Development committee, which is eager to move on the next step, using the study to attract developers.

The Committee has also been looking at the prospects for improving and redeveloping Northdale Place, a dead end street with more than 15 apartment buildings. Several of the buildings are vacant or nearly vacant, and the street has been plagued by criminal activity.

In June, Capt. Cureton was promoted to Lt. Col. and Assistant Chief of Police.

- Bob Kamp, in his last meeting as KHCC's long-time Treasurer, reported that cash available is \$13,050, year to date income is \$29,668 and expenses are \$33,310. Bob has been involved as a key KHCC fund-raiser for the past 20 years. He cautioned that Council must be careful to stay within the budget.
- Annual election (see front page for the results). Candidates who were not elected were urged to continue their involvement with KHCC.
- Presentation by Rape Crisis and Abuse Center of Hamilton County; Two staff persons provided an overview of spousal/domestic abuse, and many questions/observations were discussed. District Two Capt. Michael Cureton discussed the role of police officers in spousal or domestic abuse situation.
- Ben Pipken (CPOP Team) reviewed the second round of installing cement bumps on the walls of the Kennedy Bridge.
 - More than 25 residents participated
 - > Involvement of police officers
 - Approximately 1,000 egg-shaped multi-colored bumps have been glued
 - Positive graffiti chalked on the walls messages on the bridge ("Real Men Don't Use Drugs").
 - Informational cards given to passing motorists ("Why Bumps, and What Can You Do To Help").

- Residents expressed frustration with drug activity, not only at the bridge but at other locations. Capt. Cureton encouraged residents to persist in our commitment to maintain control over the welfare of our neighborhood.
- Capt. Cureton noted that the Citizens on Patrol may now call upon a District's Lieutenant to participate in their patrol. This will enable one of the District's key officials to have a more personal understanding of neighborhood concerns.
- Kathy Tyler noted difficulties with the tot lot at the corner of Zinsle and Coleridge. She asked if it would be possible for the Recreation Commission to limit access to the tot lot to children or children with parents, to improve the lot's lighting, and declare the immediate area a drug-free zone. Melissa Smith of the Commission noted that she would take those concerns to the Commission.
- Ce Holm introduced Dr. Cindi Menefield, the new Principal of Woodford School. Dr. Menefield expressed appreciation for the welcome to our neighborhood.
- Joanie Weidner distributed two documents about the upcoming Summer Clean-Up event on July 16.
- Joyce Hibbard of the Beautification Committee reminded residents to submit candidates to be awarded the neighborhood landscape award.
- Kathy Spoon reported on upcoming activities at the Kennedy Heights Arts Center.
