KHCC Discussion & Decisions on Disposition of **Cincinnati School Board Property**

The two main agenda items at KHCC's September meeting both involved potential development of property now owned by the Cincinnati School Board (CSB). With over 50 residents attending, KHCC voted overwhelmingly to support both of the following projects.

Replace Shroder School with over 50 Private Homes?

Shroder School is one of the properties that the School Board wants to sell before 1/1/06.

CSB hopes to benefit from a recent change in Ohio law that lets a school system sell a property to the highest bidder, without having to give preference to charter schools. The catch is that the deadline for buyers' bids was October 1, and the sale must be completed by 12/31.

Community Council's Development Committee, with the help of Clete Benken (Robison Rd. resident and an associate of Kinzelman Kline Gossman) located a developer who has now bid on the property. The developer is David Wittekind of In-Line Development. Mr. Wittekind shared his plans with residents at the September meeting, asking that KHCC support the general concept. He assured the residents he will work very closely with KHCC's Development Committee if he wins the bid.

Resolved: KHCC Supports Concept

KHCC supports in principle the concept plan presented by In-Line Development for development of the Shroder School site into 48 town houses and 7 single houses (all owner-occupied). This is conforms to the spirit and intent of our Comprehensive Community Plan.

Kennedy & Montgomery


The Cincinnati School Board owns the large lot on the corner of Kennedy & Montgomery (K&M), which historically was the site of Kennedy School and most recently was Furniture Fair.

For the past 2 years KHCC has tried to persuade the School Board to build a new school at K&M. KHCC now acknowledges that this is extremely unlikely.

Resolved: Encourage Appropriate Development

KHCC supports continued discussions with the Board of Education to encourage the property's development for residential and commercial purposes, and in the spirit and intent of our Comprehensive Community Plan. These discussions will be led by the KHCC Development Committee.


