Surveillance Camera Update

Here, at the top, is the bottom line. The system has changed. Communities will not have to pay for any of the system.

- Gun shot recognition has been added to the system. This directs a camera to look at the spot where the shot was fired
- Cameras, communications. maintenance, data storage, and some monitoring will be paid for out of City funds.
- Volunteers are still needed for some monitorina.
- All monitoring will be done at the Police Communications Center.
- No cameras on private buildings unless there is no alternative.
- The number of cameras citywide depends on City Council budget.
- Cameras will be deployed on a basis of need to reduce crime.
- > KH will probably get at least two cameras.
- At the earliest, cameras will be installed starting in July.

KH and Cincinnati Public Schools Ernest Barbeau, President KHCC

Over the last three years the Community Council has been extensively involved in the Board of Education's difficult journey with improving academic performance. Much of that journey has focused on the Board's facilities Master Plan for renovating, replacing, and eliminating school buildings.

In our neighborhood, CPS owns a total of 27 acres at three locations: the vacant lot at Kennedy & Montgomery (K&M), Shroder, and Woodford Schools.

CPS now uses the building at K&M for storage. When Shroder is vacated for the new school on Duck Creek, that property will be sold, & our community plan aims to have the Shroder property converted to owner-occupied housing. Woodford School is obsolete, overcrowded, and using trailers for classrooms.

Within the next three weeks the Board of Education will be revising its third and final phase of the facilities plan, a part of which includes K&M and Woodford. This revision was just announced two weeks ago and will be moving very quickly.

The Board's decisions will impact our neighborhood for decades.

After considerable discussion, the KHCC Board of Trustees has agreed on a set of basic principles, which we will be advocating with the school board.

Spotting SUSPICIOUS

What images enter your mind when you hear the word "suspicious?" What does it mean to be or to look suspicious?

Everyone has a different perception of "suspicious."

The CPOP office has provided a long list of "suspicious" activities that might raise you eyebrows and prompt you to alert the police. Here are a few from CPOP's long list.

Suspicious behavior may include the following actions:

- ☑ Stranger entering neighbor's house when no one's home
- ☑ Jumping fences
- ☑ Waiting in front of house when owners are gone
- ☑ Peering into vehicle or trying to open it
- Running while holding something of value
- ☑ Slow moving vehicles circling the block.
- ✓ Unusual noises, screams, glass breaking, barking dogs, etc.

Says CPOP: If you think you see a crime being committed, are the victim of a crime, or observe suspicious activity, report it immediately and accurately. Do not assume someone else has called the police.
