Immediately after Litter Magic, KHCC sent a long e-mail to a supervisor with the City's Neighborhood Services Department, with several complaints about lower Kennedy Avenue. especially along the wall.

The complaints focused on overgrown bushes and shrubs, poison ivy; litter on top of the wall; and, blocked storm sewers.

Three days later the City responded with an eight-person crew and two trucks!

Some issues still remain, such as blocked storm sewers, and the west side of lower Kennedy (in Columbia Township). I plan to pursue those issues.
