Moving Toward UDOD

On October 19, KHCC received the unanimous recommendation of the City of Cincinnati Planning Commission to adopt an Urban Design Plan (UDP) and an Urban Design Overlay District (UDOD) for the business district along Montgomery Road between Tyne and Coleridge.

What It Is

The UDP includes recommendations for future business district improvements which we believe will enhance the safety, appearance, and quality of life for our residents, business owners and users of our business district. This plan has already been reviewed by Community Council and recommended to the city by resolution in June of this year.

Once approved by City Council, the UDOD will establish quidelines for future development including, but not limited to, redevelopment projects, signage, and façade alterations. At the current time, it is KHCC's intention to request that the UDOD be comparable to the UDOD currently in place for the *Pleasant Ridge* Business District.

Next Stop

City Council's Economic Development Committee will review the plans on November 20. It could go the full Council by early December.

KHCC Revives KHURC

30 years ago KHCC created a development corporation to promote residential and commercial development in the community.

The KH Urban Redevelopment Corporation rehabbed several older houses and managed development of the northwest corner of Kennedy & Montgomery (Cornerstone Church, Geier Apartments). The Corporation has been dormant since the mid-'90's.

KHURC is returning to active status, with . One of its first aims will to be assure positive development of the large lot at Kennedy & Montgomery.

The KHCC Board has nominated an interim board for the KHURC,, and residents will vote on those recommendations on November 27.
