KHCC Annual Election 11/18 7:30

Last winter KHCC amended its constitution, moving the annual Board of Trustees election from June to November, with the elected term running from January through December.

Open seats: All 5 officers and 2 of 4 at-large members of the Board of Trustees.

The nominating committee has identified no new recruits for any of the position and recommended a slate that, if elected would return the present board with one exception: President.

After 3 years as president, Dr. Ernie Barbeau has declined to serve another term. The nominating committee has not recommended a replacement. If the office is not filled at the November election, the Administrative Vice President will serve in an acting capacity until it has been filled.

New Business in Kennedy Heights!

A new business has been just created in Kennedy Heights – the Green Corner Studios and Marketplace at 6524 Montgomery Road.

Richard Cooke, community advocate, known for leadership at the KH Arts Center has taken the next step and bought the former C-Tech landscape building (originally a Shell gas station) on the corner of Montgomery and Tyne.

Over the next 6 months, Richard plans to develop the building into working studio space for 3 artists to create art publicly on site.

On the courtyard where in the very early days, cars pulled up for gas, signage and artwork will be installed to convey a strong arts theme. Notes from KHCC's September Meeting

hanks to the 9/14 hurricane the 14 residents were almost outnumbered by our guests! Guests included Dawn Jackson, Community Liaison for Councilmember Cole; Capt. Doug Wiesman, Commander of CPD's District Two, Lt. Joe Williams, Sgt. Tucker, and Officer George Engleman; Rick McCollum, Director of PR Recreation Center; and, Maria Kreppel, Chair of Montgomery Corridor Arts Collaborative.

Residents applauded the extra time and effort that police officers in response to the storm and for extra police attention the District has recently given to PR and KH. During the Q&A that followed, residents identified several problem areas.

- Current bank balance: \$12,945.
- Treasurer Kevin Holt distributed and reviewed the Board's preliminary Budget for 2009. The final proposed budget will be presented for action at the October meeting.
- As Chair of the Nominating Committee, Kevin distributed and reviewed the preliminary slate for election to the Board. He noted that even though several residents have been approached to be the nominee for President, none have accepted the opportunity. All Board members except the president have agreed to be reelected.
- Since the Council's June meeting president Barbeau has participated in sixty-nine conferences and meetings and referred several complaints and concerns to City departments, other community resources, or to KHCC committees.
- Maria Kreppel reported on the 10/11 Street Festival to celebrate the opening of District A, the art district led by residents of Pleasant Ridge and Kennedy Heights.
- The PR Recreation Center can provide transportation for KH residents to the Center.
- Several residents stressed the need fro KHCC to expand recreational services and recruit more volunteers to assist in developing and providing such services for our young residents.
- Michele Dragga (Red Bank), Team Leader for our Citizens on Patrol, needs more neighbors to serve as volunteers with our COP.
- Robison Black Watch was established about four years ago, and is currently led by Nancy Schmidt. Recent meeting focused not only on an incident of Robison young adolescents being assaulted in Pleasant Ridge, but on being more vigilant and active with the group.

New Logo Adopted

Clete Benken reviewed the 16month process of for updating the KHCC logo. The new logo was adopted by the KHCC board at its September meeting.

The logo will appear on new signs to be developed with City funding for the Montgomery Gateway project.

After extensive meetings and review by interested residents, three logo concepts submitted to the City's graphic designers for recommendations. One of the three designs was developed by Kinoll resident Jeffrey Weidner, the other two by a city-funded consultant.

The new logo was deemed to most closely represent the desire to have a simple and adoptable logo which honors the purpose and intent of the original symbol while reflecting the new energies, values, and ideals which characterize our neighborhood today and inspire us to work toward an even brighter, more colorful future.
