KHDC Moving Forward

Would the quality of life for residents of Kennedy Heights be improved if we increased the economic well-being of neighborhood businesses and our housing stock? YES. Should neighbors like you, and organizations outside of our neighborhood, join hands to improve our neighborhood's well-being? YES.

A YES response to those two questions has led to re-establishment of the non-profit Kennedy Heights Development Corporation (KHDC). It was established in 1977 and discontinued in 1982. KHCC revived the non-profit in 2008, and our 501(c)3 application (tax deductible) is pending with the IRS. The KHCC Board appoints a majority of KHDC Board members.

Currently the KHDC's mission is being accomplished by fourteen volunteers; we do not have a staff. The volunteers reside on Aikenside, Dante, Davenant, Iberis, Kinoll, Orchard Lane, Red Bank, Robison, Rogers Park, Tyne, and Wyatt. Three priorities drive our activities and energy, as recommended by KHCC:

- Redeveloping the old Kroger site at Kennedy & Montgomery;
- Increasing the viability of the Montgomery Road Business District:
- Improving the neighborhood's housing stock.

KHDC Officers Ernie Barbeau, Chair Natalie Schoenfeld, Vice-Chair Charles Clingman, Treasurer Melissa McNally Wolfe, Secretary Jody Barkley Chairs our Nominating Committee.

In last month's Kennedy Heights News, Clete Benken, KHDC's Business Development Team Leader, wrote an extended article about activities related to the old Kroger site and the Business District. We will soon report on activities related to housing.

We are about finished with organizational tasks.We have adopted a Conflict of Interest Policy and board members have made a financial contribution to prime our budget. At the same time, we have had substantive meetings on several matters with members of City Council and City administrators; and enhanced our relationship with neighborhood and local organizations, such as District A, the region's association of community development corporations, bank officials, and other entities.

Chamber Music Concert May 17 7 pm **KH** Presbyterian


As part of its 100th Anniversary, the KH Community Presbyterian has commissioned Rick Sowash to write a special composition to be performed in July 2009.
