Composting Basics (or so says Google)

- Only "vegetable" stuff (no meats or other animal products.
- Simple, freestanding pile or in a more tidy bin
- Avoid property line & shallow tree roots.
- Start with six inch loose aeration base of twigs or brush
- Mix leaves with grass and other "green" garden trimmings for quicker compost. Mix new stuff thoroughly — especially grass.
- Keep moist but not wet.
- No animal waste (meat, dog droppings, etc.)
- Turn, fluff, or aerate occasionally
- Compost is ready to use when it is dark brown-black, crumbly, and sweet-smelling.
