Please consider nominating yourself or one of your friends or family to be elected to the KHCC Board. Nominations occur at the October Community Council meeting, followed by an election in November, with terms that begin in January.

Our officer positions include President, Vice-President for Administration, Vice-President for Community Planning, Secretary, Treasurer, and Trustee-at-Large.

As a Board member, meeting responsibilities are few with only one regularly scheduled Board meeting monthly, typically meeting prior to each Council meeting.

Substantial support, written material, and established practices are available to assist any new Board member.

President:

- 1. Preside at meetings of the Council and the Board of Trustees.
- 2. Appoint committee chairs.
- 3. Represent KHCC outside of Kennedy Heights.
- 4. Provide overall guidance and direction to KHCC activities.

Vice-President for Administration:

- 1. Assist the President as needed.
- 2. In the absence of the President, assume the duties of the latter.
- 3. Oversee fundraising.
- 4. Assure completion of the annual audit shortly after election to office.

Vice-President for Community Planning:

- 1. Provide guidance and support for review and implementation of the Comprehensive Community Plan.
- 2. Lead in the recruitment and coordination of volunteers and committees.

Secretary:

 Assure that all communications to other organizations and individuals will be sent and maintained as directed by the Board and of the Council.
 Record the minutes of Council and Board meetings and prepare them for publication.

Treasurer:

- 1. Receive all moneys of the KHCC and keep an accurate record of all receipts and expenditures.
- 2. Pay out funds authorized by the Board.
- 4. Present and distribute a financial report at each meeting of the Board and Council and at other times as requested by the Board.

Trustees-at-Large:

- 1. Represent the concerns and interests of residents in various sections of our community.
- 2. Serve as a link between the Board of Trustees and our neighborhood.
- 3. Encourage involvement of neighbors in the well-being of our community.

UPDATE ON THE KENNEDY HEIGHTS CULTURAL CENTER PROJECT

FROM ERNIE BARBEAU, CHAIR OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES, KENNEDY HEIGHTS DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION

For the past four years the neighborhood's nonprofit urban redevelopment corporation, the Kennedy Heights Development Corporation, has been focused on redeveloping the northeast corner of Kennedy and Montgomery. With critical assistance from the City the property was purchased from Cincinnati Public Schools, and transferred to the Corporation in March 2012. In June 2012, we had a terrific ground-breaking event, attended by more than 150 persons. The project is a \$3 million initiative!

The Project will serve to transform our business district as a unique arts-oriented area. The potential impact of the Cultural Center on our neighborhood's visibility, uniqueness, and viability are only limited by **your** support, energy, creativity, and generosity.

Three non-profit organizations will be co-located at the Cultural Center, formerly the old Kroger/Furniture Fair store building at 6620 Montgomery Road. The Cincinnati Art Museum's first off-campus Outreach Center will house an archived collection of art which can be viewed by the public. Kennedy Heights Montessori Center will re-locate their award-winning preschool program. The Kennedy Heights Arts Center will gain a satellite location for artist studios and

space for events, meetings, and conferences.

During spring and summer 2012, members of the Corporation's Board and several organizations provided dozens of volunteers who donated hundreds of hours of clean-up and renovation services. They cut and removed trees and shrubbery, planted trees, cut grass, picked up trash and garbage, painted the cement bases of the parking light poles and the metal barriers that are located in the parking lot, expanded the green space along Kennedy and Montgomery, and striped one section of the parking lot. They also completed a multitude of other tasks related to fundraising and the development of the Cultural Center's

Between now and February 2013 the Corporation will:

- complete the architectural plans and survey the property;
- hire an Owner's Representative to initially assist us with the preconstruction phase;
- issue roof repair and interior demolition specifications;
- develop several legal documents;

- begin the interior demolition of the building;
- develop specifications and bid plans for Phase I;
- advertise for design/build proposals;
- begin stabilization and remediation of the building;
- implement a neighborhood fundraising program; and
- apply for funding from a variety of institutions and organizations.

We expect construction to begin early 2013 and for the groundbreaking to be in the summer of 2013. In the next Corporation update, there will be information about other aspects of Phase I that will occur between February and June of next year, and details about Phase II.

A 15-member board of trustees leads the Corporation, with fourteen of those members currently living in Kennedy Heights. As volunteers, those individual trustees have provided thousands of hours of service for our neighborhood's revitalization over the past four years. Their passion, skill, expertise, and financial support have been enormously helpful, and their willingness to freely give of their expertise has been remarkable and generous.

LANDSCAPE HALL OF FAME AWARDS

When the Landscape Awards
Committee celebrated its 20th
anniversary in 2008, the committee
decided to do something unique to
honor this milestone. The result was
the establishment of the **Landscape Hall of Fame.** This award gives
special tribute to Kennedy Heights
residents who have consistently
maintained beautiful landscapes in
our neighborhood **AND** who have
won a KHCC annual Landscape
Award three or more times since the
committee's inception.

This year the committee focused on our new Landscape Hall of Fame awards and inducted two additional residences. New inductees, Mike Maloney and Jeff Dey have been residents of Kennedy Heights since 1999. The Paterson Family, Lois, Dave, Martha and Sam have been residents since 1997. On Saturday

August 25, the Committee and KHCC President Natalie Boyer presented engraved awards to the new inductees.

Landscape Hall of Fame inductees receive a distinctive engraved award and their names are added to a gold-plated plaque that is displayed at our Community Council's public events. Members are models for our neighborhood. Over the next year the Committee plans to design a page on our website to honor all Landscape Hall of Fame winners. The 2012 inductees will join Landscape Hall of Fame members listed below along with their award-winning years.*

If you wish to nominate a neighbor, business, or yourself for a 2013 Landscape Award, forms will be available next spring in the

newsletter, on the KHCC website (www.kennedyheights.org) and at Community Council meetings. Nomination forms will be due by the end of June 2013. The landscape judging will occur in early July 2013, and the criteria include color, texture, design and maintenance.



ELECTION DAY: TUESDAY NOVEMBER 6, 2012 POLLS OPEN: 6:30 AM-7:30 PM

VOTER ELIGIBILITY

You are qualified to register to vote in Ohio if you meet all the following requirements:

- 1. You are a citizen of the United States.
- 2. You will be at least 18 years old on or before the day of the general election.
- 3. You will be a resident of Ohio for at least 30 days immediately before the election in which you want to vote.
- 4. You are not incarcerated (in jail or prison) for a felony conviction under the laws of Ohio, another state or the United States.
- You have not been declared. incompetent for voting purposes by a probate court.

6. You have not been permanently denied the right to vote for violations of the election laws.

You are eligible to vote in elections in your voting precinct held more than 30 days after you are registered to vote in Ohio.

SUBMIT YOUR VOTER REGISTRATION FORM

You may register at any Bureau of Motor Vehicles office, any municipal building, any branch of the Hamilton County Public Library or at the Hamilton County Board of Elections, 824 Broadway.

Voter registration closes 30 days before a General, Primary or Special

Election. To inquire about your voter registration or where you vote, contact the Board of Elections at: www.hamilton-co.org/BOE or check out the My Vote website at www.myohiovote.com.

VOTING DAY

Remember to bring proof of identity to the polls when you vote. You may use a current and valid government photo identification card (such as a driver's license or military ID) or a copy of a utility bill, bank statement, paycheck, government check, or government document showing your name and current address. Note: You cannot use the notice the Board of Elections mailed to you.
