Open officer positions: President, Vice-President for Administration, Vice-President for Community Planning, Secretary, Treasurer, and Member at-Large. Nominations occur will at the October KHCC meeting, followed by an election at the November KHCC meeting.

Service terms and responsibilities: Service term starts January 2015. All positions have 1-year terms except for Member At-Large which has a 2-year term. Meeting responsibilities are reasonable with only one regularly scheduled monthly Board meeting, typically held before each Council meeting. Substantial support and written material are available to help any new Board member. See the following list for the responsibilities of each position:

- President: Preside at meetings of the Council and the Board of Trustees; appoint committee chairs; represent the KHCC outside Kennedy Heights; and provide overall guidance and direction for KHCC activities.
- Vice-President for Administration: Assist the President as needed; in the absence of the President, assume the duties of the latter; oversee fundraising; and assure completion of the annual audit shortly after election to office.
- Vice-President for Community Planning: Provide guidance and support for review and implementation of the Comprehensive Community Plan; and lead in the recruitment and coordination of volunteers and committees.
- Secretary: Assure that all communications to other organizations and individuals are sent
 and maintained as directed by the Board and of the Council; record the minutes of Council
 and Board meetings and prepare them for publication.
- Treasurer: Receive all moneys of the KHCC and keep an accurate record of all receipts and expenditures; pay out funds authorized by the Board; present and distribute a financial report at each meeting of the Board and Council and at other times as requested by the Board
- Member at-Large: Represent the concerns and interests of residents in various sections of our community; serve as a link between the Board of Trustees and our neighborhood; and encourage involvement of neighbors in the well-being of our community.

HELP PREVENT DOG ATTACKS IN KENNEDY HEIGHTS

everal people in Kennedy Heights have recently experienced unpleasant to disturbing experiences from dogs whose owners did not keep them on a leash. These incidents have ranged from a dog biting one person, to one dog threatening and doing physical harm to a second dog, to several incidents of dogs menacing other dogs with either the owner not present or not able to stop the behavior. All these attacks have been done by dogs that were not leashed.

Officer George Engleman, our Cincinnati Police Department liaison, urges residents to file a police report if a dog bites or attacks a person or another animal. Even if a report is not filed, the police still encourage people to contact them with pertinent information about the event so they can follow up with the dog's owners. A second report or infringement will result in a fine. Officer Engleman's phone number is 979-4465.

The City of Cincinnati has also been working on a more stringent policy regarding dog misbehavior and will introduce a new policy soon. Its importance cannot be denied in the wake of the June incident in which a pit bull savagely attacked a young girl and brings into focus

the dreadful consequences that can result when owners do not properly attend to their dogs.

Owners, please be aware that you are responsible for protecting others from your dog's misbehavior and that you are liable for any physical harm that your dog inflicts. In Kennedy Heights, we pride ourselves on having a community of neighbors who value others and want to provide a safe environment for all. With heightened awareness of this critical issue, the hope is that everyone will work toward keeping both our dogs and each other safe.

here were 100 ways of remembering our 100th anniversary as a neighborhood of Cincinnati. On June 22 and 28, more than 500 diverse residents came together to celebrate our Centennial with a home and garden tour, parade, festival and dinner.

We claimed as our home the Kennedy Heights Arts Center—the heart of our community and a perfect setting for our celebration.

We claimed our community ownership of The Caring Place where our neighbors in need can come for support. Because of the artists in the Kennedy Collective who donated art work and The Caring Place who donated baskets to raffle, we raised \$750 which will fund The Caring Place for one day.

We claimed our identity as a diverse, welcoming community and joined to tell our story. Former residents came from near and far and marveled at how new leadership is carrying on the work they began in the 1960s. Current residents opened their homes and gardens to the public and \$355 was raised for the Kennedy Heights Community Council. Schools, churches, businesses, organizations, and individuals paraded up

Kennedy Avenue to the delight of all.

THE KENNEDY HEIGHTS EXPERIMENT: FROM HILLTOP SUBURB TO MULTI-RACIAL COMMUNITY, 1882 TO 2014

s this book nears completion, I wanted to thank Kennedy Heights for the wonderful cooperation that I and my students in the Public History Practicum at UC had in writing it. First, we thank Professor James Cebula, a longtime resident who was deeply committed to Kennedy Heights and its history. We are honored to have been able to continue the work that his passing interrupted several years ago.

Many others in Kennedy Heights contributed to the creation of the book. Ernie Barbeau contacted me in November 2013 and arranged for me to meet with him, Michelle Dillingham, Sr. Carren Herring, RSM, and Christine Schumacher to discuss the project. Ernie also shared his extensive collection of Kennedy Heights documents and his wealth of knowledge about the neighborhood. Christine included my students in several wonderful oral history interviews which Sr. Carren and John Bange transcribed.

Mary Kamp took several students and me on a great neighborhood tour. Ellen Muse-Lindeman gave us access to extensive historical Community Council records at the Kennedy Heights Arts Center. Michelle Dillingham let us take these items temporarily to the History Department, which helped us immensely in our research. Kendra Brown gave us access to ten recent years of the Community newsletter. Colin Cronin took our work and turned it into an attractive book. George Kalomeres introduced me to the neighborhood in the late 1970s when he hired me as a handyman to work on his building at the corner of Montgomery and Kennedy. There I met some of the activists in the Kennedy Heights Community Council for the first time.

Finally, my students, Holly Beckemeyer, Abby Smith, Anne Delano Steinert, Nicole Landisch, Alex Parker, Kevin Rigsbee, and Shannon Hokanson, did an immense amount of work in a short amount of time. Anne and Nicole did additional research after the end of the semester. In addition, Anne edited the "Sidebar" stories written by several class members that are sprinkled throughout the book.

We hope you enjoy the book as much as we enjoyed researching and writing it.
