Some Neighborhood Historical Subjects

My research is focused on the 1850–1914 period. For that time period, the following topics need more research: Yononte Inn (1887--1909), Kennedy School (1886?-1980), Christ Episcopal Mission (1890–1904); and biographies of the mayors of the Village of KH (such as McHugh, Staley, Thrasher, and Zinsle).

There are many topics that could be explored for the time period of 1914–2000, such as: development of our African American community; neighborhood parks (Drake, Kennedy, Tot-lot, Lang Playfield, and June R. Alexander Playground); development of the business district, other businesses (such as Ewers) and organizations (Juneteenth, KH Montessori Center, Ken-Sil, The Caring Place, and Woodford School); and history of the 10-20 oldest existing residences.
