The Kennedy Heights Development Corporation and Community Council's Aging In Place Initiative wants to know what our residents aged 50+ envision for the future housing choices in Kennedy Heights.

In mid-April we will begin a random sampling of several hundred of our 50+ residents by mailing them a survey that will review a wide variety of housing options, with some ideas that might not have thought about.



## THE CARING PLACE

ho is responsible for the Caring Place? Including the director, Sharifah Tafari, The Caring Place has a volunteer Board of people from the community, headed by President Chuck McClain.

President McClain writes, "I would like to say thank you to the Kennedy Heights community and surrounding areas for all the support and volunteer help we receive throughout the year. As you well know, the need has never been greater in our community as our numbers from 2015 show:

- 918 households served, consisting of 650 adults and 268 children. Of those, 137 households came for the first time.
- This is an 18% increase in households from 2014.
- This increase in clients also resulted in 953 more volunteer hours worked during pantry hours.
- Contributions decreased by 21% and expenses increased by 6%.

"We met the need this year, but barely. We had to dip into our reserves for the first time in many years and overall ran a deficit of nearly \$17,000. I don't think the needs of the community will lessen anytime soon so

the Board Members will be out there working hard to secure the funds we need to operate. We will be visiting local businesses, churches, schools and other organizations that have been there for us in the past. We sincerely appreciate everything they have done but we need additional revenue to meet the ever growing needs of Kennedy Heights, Pleasant Ridge, Silverton, and Golf Manor."

It's obvious to me that over the past 4 years our numbers have gone up. We try to offer food and other necessities to help tide people over from month to month, but it's never enough.
