### **CULTURAL CAMPUS WELCOMES THIRD TENANT**

ikido of Cincinnati has purchased the third and last unit at the Kennedy Heights Cultural Campus, currently home to the Kennedy Heights Montessori Center and the Carl, Robert, Richard and Dorothy Lindner Annex of the Kennedy Heights Arts Center. The unit will be transformed into Aikido's new *dojo*, which means "training place." This location will replace their current location on Pad Bank Poad. Aikido, often translated as "

### **SAY HELLO TO SCRAP IT UP!**

fter two years of planning, Scrap It Up is now open! The non-profit creative reuse center in Pleasant Ridge is located at 5933 Ridge Ave.

Scrap It Up is a community resource for artists, students, parents, teachers, Scouts - anyone in need of affordable materials! Volunteers will offer classes and workshops, as well as display sample projects that patrons can make in a class or at home.

The store is a completely volunteer-driven project and children and adults by showing that multiple uses are

helps raise environmental awareness in children and adults by showing that multiple uses are possible for items that may have previously been thrown away. By collecting and providing access to a wide range of materials, Scrap It Up shows the potential for reuse, making it easier for people to develop new skills, be creative, and think outside the box. The store is broadening and enhancing the local economy, responding to a demand for upcycling and repurposing of materials, inspiring people to rethink consumer habits, and lowering demand for and environmental costs of newly made items. All income received from the sale of materials is reinvested in the mission.

### ach year the City of Cincinnati allocates funds

to neighborhoods through the Department of Community and Economic Development. This year we will receive \$6,800 to help publish our
