

PROGRESSIVE DINNER NEEDS YOU



In 2019, the difficult decision was made to cancel the long-standing tradition of the Kennedy Heights Progressive Dinner. The decision was not made lightly, but was naturally met with great disappointment from many neighbors. An ad hoc committee of six met to discuss its future. The committee researched past dinners, talked to members of the planning committee, studied the results of past dinners and talked with Liz Blume of the Xavier University Community Building Institute.

For the long term, the committee is recommending convening small groups of residents to discuss the dinner in a larger context. They recommend that Kennedy Heights recruit leaders from different areas of the neighborhood for ongoing development. They have several ideas of how to "relaunch" the event in Fall 2020, but they need neighborhood participation.


Do you have a loved one with Alzheimer's or dementia?

WELCOME ARTIST-IN-RESIDENCE: LEESA HAPPAPURO



Announcing the 2020 Community Artist-in-Residence: Leesa Haapapuro.

Leesa is an interdisciplinary artist from Dayton, Ohio,

proficient in a wide variety of techniques from stone carving to welding to weaving. Leesa's efforts to connect with others through her artistic practice are often radical and transformative. She has made socially engaged, collaborative art projects and site-specific installations with more than 10 communities in Ohio. She received the City of Dayton's Community Artist award and is a three -time recipient of The Montgomery County Regional Arts and Cultural Individual Artist Fellowship.



Leesa will be in residence at KHAC from April 15 to May 23. She will collaborate with residents of all ages on public art installations in the community. The works will explore a theme of coded messages. The artist and community members will create sculptures that contain a hidden meaning. The works will be installed in spaces throughout the neighborhood, popping up in surprising locations and challenging us all to decode the messages within.

KENNEDY AVENUE BRIDGE REPLACEMENT PROJECT






eginning in mid-April (but after our beloved Sap Run) the Kennedy Avenue Bridge will be closed in order to be completely replaced. The existing bridge was originally built in 1932. At 85 years old, pridge has exceeded its useful life. The bridge is

the bridge has exceeded its useful life. The bridge is inspected annually and while it is currently safe for all legal

vehicles, the bridge is in poor condition with widespread deterioration of the concrete structure. The deterioration has now advanced to the point where rehabilitation is not feasible, necessitating replacement.





The road will be closed from mid-April until mid-November, with final completion by the end of 2020. Detours will be clearly marked but will cut through more dense residential zones. Please be aware of speed limits and respectful of neighbors and pedestrians through this time of transition.

Kennedy Park will remain open throughout the project, though some driveway reconstruction and repaving will be needed.

The project has been estimated at a total of just under \$2.9MM and is covered 100% by a Federal grant. The construction will be performed by Sunesis Construction.
