REMEMBERING LOCAL HERO, FIRST LIEUTENANT JOHN H. LEAHR



n 2018, a memorial was installed at the Kennedy Heights Arts Center, commemorating the legacy of Combat Pilot First Lieutenant John H. Leahr.

In World War II, Lt. Leahr flew fighters for the Tuskegee Airmen, the all black pilots unit. The Cincinnati native and Kennedy Heights resident died March 27, 2015, at age 94.

The memorial features an original sculpture by Jarret Hawkins, which was the culmination of hours of volunteer time and financial support from the Ohio Arts Council, the Community Council, and friends and neighbors.

The hope was to hold a public celebration in May to honor the memory of this esteemed resident. Unfortunately, due to COVID, we will be unable to gather. You are encouraged to visit the memorial, while abiding by the guidelines of social distancing, and to reflect on the incredible service that Leahr gave to his country.

ABSENTEE VOTING IS OPEN NO IN-PERSON VOTING

The coronavirus in-person stopped in Ohio's voting Primary, but absentee voting has resumed. There will be no inperson voting.



SMART 911: SAVING TIME IS SAVING LIVES



he Cincinnati Police Department is asking residents to register with the Smart911 program.

This program helps emergency responders act more efficiently during this time of overwhelmed resources.

Smart911 creates a Safety Profile. Any time you make an emergency call from a phone registered with your safety profile, the 9-1-1 system recognizes your phone number and automatically displays your profile on the screen of the call taker who receives your call.

Your Safety Profile can include details about all members of the household, all phone numbers (mobile, landline or VOIP) and all addresses. **Users should add any details that 9-1-1 call takers may need to effectively assist you during an emergency—medical conditions, medications, vehicles, emergency contact persons, pets and other information.** Setting up a profile can take as little as 5 to 10 minutes.

CENSUS 2020: RESPONDING MATTERS MORE THAN EVER



You should have received three mailings with your unique ID for completing the census online. If you did not, go to www.my2020census.gov/login and select "If you do not have a Census ID, click here." Respond quickly—don't force census workers to risk their health going door to door. The census determines how the government distributes emergency funding, so your participation has never been more vital.

ARTIST-IN-RESIDENCE

Multi-disciplinary artist Leesa Haapapuro will be in "virtual residence" from April 20 - May 31. Working from her studio in Dayton, Ohio, Leesa will create a public art installation with a message of hope from our community, to our community. This message will be developed from online submittals from residents like yourself, then translated into plants using "floriology" (the coded language of plants).

You can participate by creating your own garden art for your front yard, front door, or window. Free kits (sanitized for safety) with weather-resistant materials and instructions can be picked up or delivered to your home. As we walk around the neighborhood, we will see and be inspired by these messages of hope! Once we can gather again, your smaller plants will be added onto the art installation at KHAC.


