Next, please attend our Community Council Meeting at 7:30 p.m. on March 15. Representatives from City Planning will make a final presentation, incorporating the priority feedback received on March 5th. After the presentation, all present members will vote to move the Plan forward through City Hall. After that, Steering Committee members will present the plan to the City Planning Commission in April, and finally to City Council in May. **Once approved by City Council, the plan will be officially adopted and will help guide decisions in the neighborhood for approximately the next ten years!** This is the last chance for you to make sure your perspective is represented in this long-lasting document. Please do not miss these opportunities to participate.

PROPOSED DENSITY CHANGES AT CINCINNATI CITY HALL

Housing has been a hot topic in the city for many years now. Council-member Liz Keating has sponsored an Ordinance that would remove land area/unit (density) limitations in the zoning code. These changes would only apply to <u>existing</u> Multi-family, Office, Commercial, Urban Mix, Manufacturing, and Riverfront zoning districts.

Removing these limitations is among the strategies the previous City Administration recommended to increase the supply and availability of housing within the City. The recommendation was made in a March 16, 2021 report to City Council, which inspired Keating's proposal.

Right now, it is unclear how this might affect Kennedy Heights. Only about 20% of our neighborhood contains existing zoning that would be impacted by these changes, and our neighborhood plan clearly indicates residents' desire to maintain a quiet environment not bustling with businesses and dense apartments. That being said, prices are skyrocketing and we will need to be creative to fight to keep residents in their homes as costs climb.

On Friday, February 4, the Ordinance was taken up by the City Planning Commission. The meeting lasted for more than five hours and 55+ community members participated, speaking both in support and opposition of the Ordinance. The Ordinance received a tie vote of 3-3, meaning it failed in the Commission. Keating opted to move it to City Council without revision. At the time of writing, it is likely it will be sent to the City Council Housing Committee by Wednesday, February 9, but it may sit in Committee for an undetermined period of time. We will keep you updated as best we can.

THE SAP RUN 5K RETURNS! SATURDAY, APRIL 9, 2022

Kennedy Heights offers an annual tradition each spring to encourage KHers and friends to emerge from hibernation and work out the winter kinks. This 5K (or 10K or 15K or bike ride!) kicks off race season with a challenging course that rewards you with a breakfast. Volunteers are always needed to put up route signs in advance, check-in registrants, direct traffic during the race, distribute breakfast, and clean up.

VOTE! PRIMARY ELECTIONS MAY 3, 2022

You're an essential part of our democracy, and every election matters. Pan ahead so you can enact your American right.

ARE YOU REGISTERED?

Don't wait to find out at the polls whether or not you are registered to vote. **Voter registration deadline is April 4.** Check your registration online:

votehamiltoncountyohio.gov/check-registration-status/

or call 513-632-7000. ennedy Heights residents have more than one polling location available to them, so you can confirm your polling location this way.

Important: If you are already registered <u>but have moved</u> and/or changed your name, you must update registration.

VOTE BY MAIL

Anyone may vote by mail, but they must complete a Vote-by-Mail Application. These can be found online:

votehamiltoncountyohio.gov/voting-options/mail/

or call 513-632-7039 or 513-632-7044, or pick up at the Board of Elections Office located at 4700 Smith Rd, Cincinnati OH 45212, or at any Hamilton County Public Library. <u>If your name or address has changed you MUST update information</u> with the Board of Elections before attempting to vote by mail.

Applications must be received by the Board of Elections by noon on the third day before Election Day. Because your ballots must be mailed to you, give yourself lots of time.

DO YOUR HOMEWORK

Sample ballots will be posted online 46 days before Election Day. They can be viewed online at

GREATER CINCINNATI WATER WORKS PROGRAMS FOR TENANTS & HOMEOWNERS

GCWW has funds available to help renters keep their water on. Tenants residing in the City of Cincinnati may be eligible for Emergency Rental Assistance that will pay up to 18 months of past due and current water, sewer, and storm water charges accrued after March 2020.

MAKE A DIFFERENCE THROUGH NEIGHBORHOOD MINI-GRANTS

The Community Council is piloting a mini-grant program to empower neighbors to achieve pet projects throughout the neighborhood.

The Council is dedicating \$1,000 to fund four different mini-grants. The grants will be competitive meaning that people will need to fill out an application in order to receive the funds. Grants are available in amounts of \$100-\$500 as funds remain available. Eligible projects must be public projects; they cannot be on private property. Applications will be available on kennedyheights.org, emailing treasurer@kennedyheights.org, or calling 513-202-4345.

Ideas include: funding a van rental for community food drives; constructing a Little Free Library; community garden projects, etc. Applications will be rolling until all four grants are given out. Recipients will be announced at Community Council meetings.


COMMUNITY DAY AT KHAC
