While Cecil used to be more active with the restaurant by doing the grilling, a recent illness keeps him away from the smoke and leaves him providing customer service and working as the full time purchaser. One would think that would be enough to send anyone home in search of a glass of wine and a hot bath. But not Mary. When Mary joined us, she explained that she also owns Mary's Vintage Boutique next door, has a cleaning service and babysits in the evenings. AND, she tells me that Domino's is paying \$20/hr. and she's planning on driving for them! Why so many jobs? Because, as she says in her Jamaican accent, "bills have to be paid!"

The two met at a lighting company. Cecil was a painter of outdoor light fixtures and Mary was an inspector on his line. Apparently, Cecil passed the inspection, because they have been married since. Their union brought together sixteen children—which includes two sets of twins. Cecil refers to their blended family as the *Black Brady Bunch without the maid*. (They recently lost a 41-year old child in Jamaica.)

Cecil has been a resident of Kennedy Heights since 1985. He used to drive for senior services and while there developed a Cincinnati tour for the seniors so they could always be up on the news of the changes around the Queen City.

Mary has been in the country since she was twelve, originally landing in New York. She came to Cincinnati with her older sister. Mary remembers standing on a barstool as a child helping her mother cook. Her mother also owned her own business.

The early training seems to have been a gift to Mary. The things she learned as a child have provided her the freedom to work as she needs, which gives her the freedom she so desires to take time for her family.

The Solomons wanted to share that they also have vegan offerings. They are open Monday through Saturday from 10am to 7pm. And when you come, please take note of the many paintings on the wall. And if you see one you like, know that they are all for sale.
