

20 Years of Cheer: A Look Back at Winterfest

What is now known as Winterfest began twenty years ago, when a Kennedy Heights volunteer organized a tree lighting in front of the Geier Apartments along Montgomery Road, known as the KH Holiday Celebration, which occurred on Saturday, December 13,

The first event to be officially called Winterfest took place the following year on December 3, 2004. This event included TWO tree lightings, at both the PR Rec Center and the Kennedy Heights Art Center, and also included luminaries, a children's party, and free horse-drawn carriage rides.

The carriage rides continued to be part of Winterfest through 2008 but had to be discontinued in 2009 due to budget constraints. In 2017, Winterfest expanded to include festivities in the Lindner Annex at the corner of Kennedy and Montgomery. The 2018 Winterfest even included an international art exhibit featuring art by students in Cincinnati as well as students from our sister city of Kharkiv in Ukraine.

Unfortunately, due to health concerns during the COVID-19 pandemic, Winterfest did not occur in 2020 or 2021, but the event successfully returned in 2022.

Though it has changed over the years, Winterfest continues to include the traditional staples of tree lighting, live music and singing, and tasty treats. But most importantly, Winterfest is about gathering together to celebrate and enjoy the community we have built in Kennedy Heights and Pleasant Ridge. We hope to see you for Winterfest 2023!
